RICHARD BURKE, PRESIDENT OF THE CANON FOUNDATION IN EUROPE from 1987-1998 died unexpectedly in March this year at the age of 83. Former Minister of Education for Ireland, Mr. Burke always had a high regard for education. The idea of establishing a foundation which granted research scholarships fitted well in this plan. A foundation without frontiers or restrictions allowing students to pursue research in all research fields regardless of discipline. With this idea in mind, he approached Canon Inc. in Tokyo who were excited about the idea and 'set the wheels in motion' for a foundation in commemoration of the 25th anniversary of the company in Europe. In 1987, the Canon Foundation in Europe was born.

CANON FELLOWS from the 1990's who had the privilege of meeting Mr. Burke will remember him as an inspiring, eloquent and lively character who held personal freedom and development as some of the most important values in life.

27 YEARS ON, we pay gratitude to all our Fellows as testament to the accomplishment of Burke's mission, with more than 350 Canon Foundation Fellow 'ambassadors' spread throughout Europe and Japan. All have benefitted from an unforgettable experience overseas with the freedom to explore research in a unique way.






SHINING BRONZE CUCKOOS IN NEW CALEDONIA. BY CANON FELLOW DIANA BOLOPO (2015)


DURING MY STAY at Rikkyo University, Tokyo, at the Department of Life Science, I intended to establish the bases for the project on the use of chemical signalling for kin recognition among the shining bronze cuckoo. In order to do that, I intended to observe and capture shining bronze cuckoos and obtain wax and blood samples from them, in New Caledonia. Unfortunately, the season was the driest in the last 17 years and the breeding population of their host was low and so it was the cuckoo activity. As a consequence I was able to capture only one adult (below), however I discovered something very interesting, this cuckoo species did not produce wax either, as it happened with the common cuckoo in Japan. This fact led me to new questions about whether the lack of wax production is a common trait in brood parasites which I am currently discussing with Jim Briskie in New Zealand, as it could represent a starting point for new project and collaboration.
