


Bio:



Project: Silent Canary





Project: No Man's Land

For seven years now, activists have been trying to save the remains of the Hambach Forest from being cut by the energy supplier RWE, who wants to enlarge an open pit lignite mine. Together with the neighbouring open pit mines Garzweiler and Inden, Hambach forms Europe's largest source of CO2 emissions.

While the protests forced the government to consider an earlier end of coal mining in Germany, for the inhabitants of Manheim or Immerath, every protest will probably be too late. These villages share the fate with many others of being resettled in favour of the lignite.


At the end of the day they go to bed together and tell each other goodnight, only to repeat everything the next day.








Project: Politcal Hectares

Extreme economic differences, racial thinking, as well as corruption split the South African society. Even 25 years after the end of Apartheid many questions remain open, major problems unsolved. Perhaps the biggest: The Land-question. Who is allowed to farm it, who can call it their home? The white minority who makes up for only 8.5% of the South African population owns 73% of the land. Far-left political parties like the EFF demand expropriation of farmland without compensation. The boer landowners feel threatened, isolate themselves and radicalize. No one wants to compromise. Conflict between black and white rises. Attacks on farmer and their land occur.



Project: Beyond Forests and Meadows

In the 1980s a new settlement was built above the Tyrolean village of Tarrenz: Obtarrenz. Along two streets new houses are being built, the population is doubling within only one decade. Today, almost 40 years later, the majority of the residents will soon retire and a part of the younger generation will take over the houses of their parents with conversions. A last road is being built on the edge of the forest, a new architectural style emerged. There is peace in the air, or maybe lethargy – you just can't decide. This photo series reflects upon the developments happening to a small settlement in western Austria, in times of urbanization, modernization and rural depopulation.



To be technically sound is important, but he always allows himself the space and opportunity to disregard what you might learn at school. His photographs have always been based on a feeling first, and then finding a way to frame and capture it.

Project: The Days When The Sun Goes Cold

The work focuses on the physical appearance and transformation of Philippe, a man Tayla met at a suicide prevention clinic in Paris. Tayla makes use of proximity and intimacy to show the internal trauma and isolation he encounters when suffering from depression. Images of daily routine are used in conjustion with Philippe's depression, showing the complexity, disguise and lonliness of the mental illness.

Project: New Alpine Landscapes







Project: Topando Pared




Project: Jurujuba





As he states, "I don't know if I have something to say, but I feel like I have a different perspective of seeing things. I always want to go under the surface and there is no need to be understood by the general public".


Project: Metabolism



Project: Girl Who Used To Be

In this series I take pictures of femininity trying not to be an objective researcher, but to pass all these images through myself, compare them with my personal experience. The pictures were taken in a small Crimean province, town of Primorskiy where I was born.

As many people of my age I spent my childhood and adolescence surrounded by women. When I left my hometown and acquired some independence I started comparing myself with all these local women and thinking which one of them I would have been like if I have stayed there. I think about women who grew up among the freedom of beautiful nature contrasting that much with conservative and well-established people's ideas about the world and themselves.


I shoot women of different ages, those who live in my memories and my past, those who echo inside of me. I think about whether they manage to save themselves and not to integrate into the monotonous song of an average post-Soviet village. I think about how much this closed provincial world shapes dreams and desires of girls and women who live there, about how ambivalently they combine femininity and ambitions. I think about myself as a little girl who just begins to learn to be a woman and doesn't know what kind of future is waiting for her in such a big country but such a small village. I shoot these women and I see reflections of myself, my mother and my grandmother.

I feel like an integral part of this world where the infinite sea-line touches dozens of people's horizons of hopes, fears, nostalgia and expectations






Born in Ludwigshafen am Rhein, Germany in 1993, of Filipino, Russian and German descent, Carsten Kalaschnikow is a freelance documentary photographer. Due to his origins and upbringing, his work focuses on historical and cultural identity, the phenomenon of migration and borders. He is currently studying Photojournalism and Documentary Photography at Hanover's University of Applied Sciences and Arts.

Project: The black girl looks out of the window

The Ottoman slave trade, which was part of an increasingly globalized trafficking network of the early modern period, brought millions of people from the surrounding regions of Europe, Asia, and Africa to the Ottoman Empire. While abolition and emancipation movements occurred in various forms throughout the last century of the empire's history, slavery remained in practice until its very end. In recent decades, the ignored history of the Ottoman slave trade $\frac{1}{2}$ has received more attention, but there has been considerably less discussion of how enslaved people brought to the empire contributed to its socioeconomic and cultural transformation and where the descendants of such people can be found today. After being released from slavery the Afro-Turks were relegated to a situation that left them completely unprotected: without possession they were more or less forced to stay and work at the plantations without the legal obligation of the landowners to take care of them: to give food and shelter. It has been estimated that there are about 20.000 - 80.000 Turks of African origin living in Muğla, Ula, Köyceğiz, Arcata and Dalaman regions. These people have for long been culturally adapted within Turkish society and as a consequence there is almost nothing that indicates an African heritage in a cultural sense. As a result of the search for the own roots certain ancestral ceremonies and african traditions have been revived. And the search goes on.





Project: Katyusha. In the Mood for Love.Thousands of young women from Russia and Ukraine decide to work abroad. China is especially attractive for many of them. There are many employment possibilities in the entertainment industry, where the most important criterion is physical beauty. Usually, this kind of work is illegal.

To begin this story, I went to China specially and set myself up the job of a "party girl", or rather "a girl who provides entertainment in the company of alcohol" to use a more direct translation. For short, such establishments are called KTV. Often such work involves bodily contact. Depending on the wishes of the client and the consent of the girl, this work can take on a more intimate turn. All photos were taken secretly with a phone.



The truth is that there will never be an absolute contentment in these people's lives, yet they continue to be strung along, on a reassured belief that the subculture will eventually pay-out.



Project: HorseWomanship







With the project "DIVA: No one can be himself" she won the first prize for best portfolio at the Photolux Festival(2018). By virtue of this recognition, the award-winning selection was screened during the Luz del Norte Festival in Mexico City (2019). A selection of that project was selected and exposed during "Giornate Magnum Photos" by Fondazione Carispezia in collaboration with Magnum Agency. In 2019 she attended the International Master in Documentary Photography with Davide Monteleone.

Project: DIVA. No one can be himself

The project was born in May 2018, when I decided to tell the story of Francesco, a twenty-six-year old Italian queer from Sesto Fiorentino, a small town just outside Florence, where he still lives. What emerges from the narrative is the path Francesco faced in living his identity as an expression of normality, in a society that is not yet ready to accept all of the different facets of a human being. The boy's life is characterized by the symbiotic relationship with his sister Eleonora, who together with him undertook a path of physical, emotional and creative transformation: both of them underwent surgery to fight obesity; Eleonora supports her brother in the daily affirmation of her identity and together they have formed a band, "Glitter Diamonds". The first piece performed by the duo is titled "DIVA". Photography represents the trait d'union that allows the viewer to focus on the experience and the metamorphosis of the protagonist. The experience of Francesco, thanks to the comparison with his family and our relationship, becomes a means to convey the courage to show oneself as one is. The project, consists of images accompanied by audio contributions: interviews with some crucial life moments of the protagonist and the suggestive single "DIVA" sung a cappella by Francesco.

ABOUT THE CANON STUDENT DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME

At Canon Europe, we understand the importance of dedication to photography and support not only existing professionals and prosumers, but also nurture the next generation of photographers in a shared passion, helping them to tell the greatest stories.

In 2017, we launched the Canon Student Development Programme, partnering with the world's leading photographers and videographers to harness their knowledge and passion, to inspire generations of like-minded individuals. The bespoke Programme takes place annually at the Visa pour l'Image Festival of Journalism held in Perpignan, France, in September.

Since its inception in 1990, Visa pour l'Image has been a forum at which each and every recorded moment or event of modern visual history has been presented and discussed in dedicated lectures or panels. The annual event is, therefore, considered by the industry as the most relevant international documentary and photojournalism platform. In its last edition, it welcomed over 200 000 visitors to the 20 exhibitions and more than 18 000 attendees to the six evening screenings.

2019 also played host to the third edition of the Canon Student Development Programme, during which over 240 students from 115 universities and schools, guided by 27 highly recognised mentors, were hosted by Canon for three days.

With a focus on visual storytelling to elevate the impact of narratives and aid the development of the authorial signature, the initiative aims to offer a wide range of opinions and perspectives, promoting constructive debate over trends and developments in the imaging Industry.

During the Programme, each student's portfolio is reviewed by Canon Europe with these benefits in mind. From the hundreds presented in 2019, we have collated a selection of 25 portfolios which best showcase the authorial capacity of the new generation of professionals, as signalled by the mentors, and bring to life the breadth of stories these young photographers have to tell.

We wish to extend our thanks to all participating students, their schools and their professors, as well as the mentors who supported us in this incredible initiative.

At the Canon Student Development Programme at Visa pour l'Image, I had the opportunity to engage with a diverse group of photography students from all over Europe, which allowed me to survey a wide range of photographic practices and examine emerging talents.

In order to stay fresh and relevant in what we do as photo editors and photo producers, we need to regularly question and renew our approach to photography to ensure a healthy future for the medium.

Engaging with this new generation of image makers is an invaluable part of this process for me.

To name but a few talents from the Canon Student Development Programme, in 2019 I had the pleasure of discovering the work of German photographer **Daniel Chatard**.

Daniel worked on an environmental project called "No Man's Land", that looks at the brown coal district in North Rhine-Westphalia where a conflict between locals and environmental activists on one side, and mining employees and the police on the other has arisen over the use of one of Germany's last remaining primary forests. "No man's land" is a very accomplished body of work and Daniel found his own visual language to tell the story in a quiet way that avoids visual stereotypes of conflict.

Another inspiring discovery for me was the more conceptual work by Finnish photographer **Onni Aaltonen**, who photographed night shoppers in a 24h supermarket in Helsinki. He always photographed his subjects between 1 and 5am with a flashlight stopping them in their tracks in front of overflowing shelves of produce. He combined his portraits with still life's from the mall, such as stools, light fittings highlighting the absurdity of these lonely, sleepless places.

Both student photographers showed a willingness to take risks and the quest to express themselves in a personal and authentic visual language, which made their work stand out to me.

I assign many established and emerging artists and photographers internationally and it is spotting this kind of talent that is the exciting part of my work as a director of photography.


