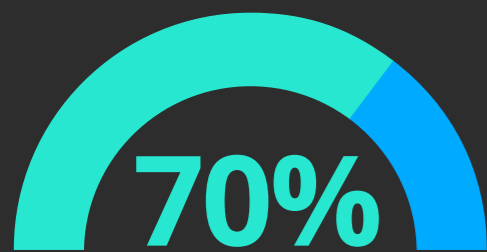

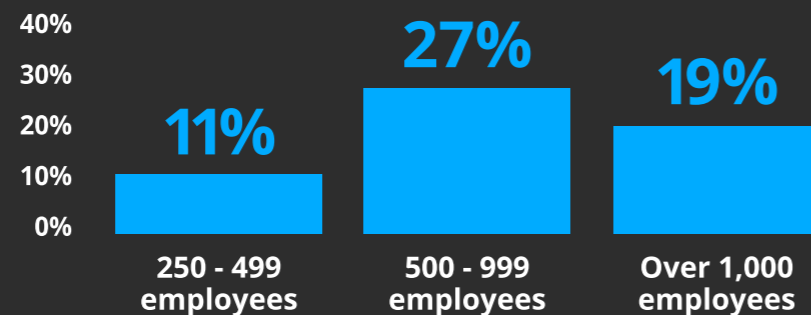

Organisations reporting that they are "completely confident" in the security of the print infrastructure

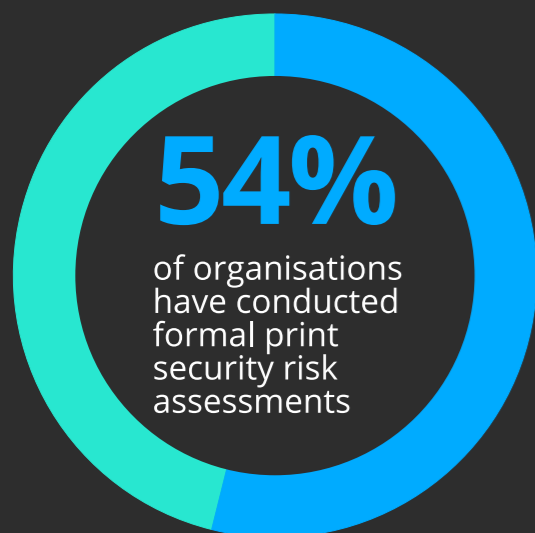


The majority of organisations have experienced a print-related data loss over the past year

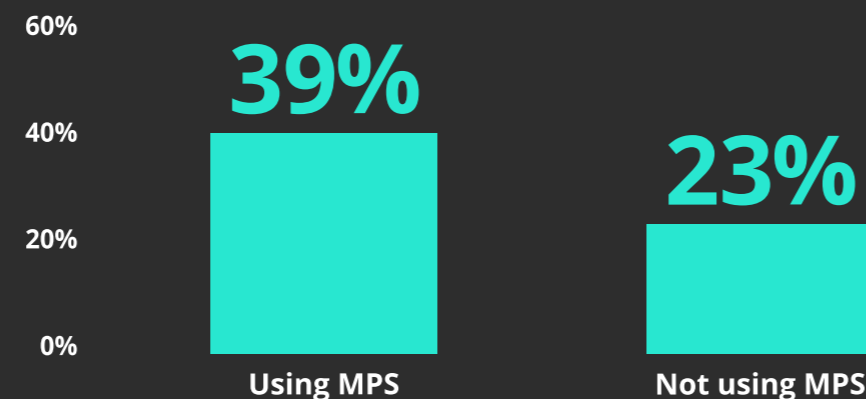
