Regulation (EU) 2025/40 on Packaging and Packaging Waste Regulation (PPWR)

At Canon, we are committed to complying with applicable EU requirements on packaging and packaging waste. The Packaging and Packaging Waste Regulation (PPWR), which replaces Directive 94/62/EC, establishes a harmonised framework to reduce packaging waste, improve recyclability and reuse, increase recycled content, and introduce harmonised labelling and information requirements across the single market. The PPWR forms a key part of the EU's transition towards a circular economy.

The information in this factsheet reflects Canon's current understanding and is provided for general guidance only. As legislation and requirements may change, the content may not be comprehensive or applicable to all circumstances. Readers should consider this information alongside other relevant sources when making decisions.

Compliance Approach

- Canon complies with all PPWR requirements applicable as of 12 August 2026 and continues to prepare for further requirements as they become applicable under the Regulation's phased implementation.
- Canon's approach reflects the phased implementation of the PPWR and takes into account the development of delegated and implementing acts, harmonised standards and technical guidance.
- Canon continues to monitor EU and national regulatory developments to support timely implementation of subsequent PPWR requirements.

Declarations of Conformity

- Canon has established and maintains Packaging Declarations of Conformity (DoCs) for applicable packaging in accordance with the PPWR requirements applicable as of 12 August 2026.

- Canon maintains the supporting technical documentation required to demonstrate compliance with the applicable PPWR requirements. This documentation will be made available to competent authorities where required and may be used to support customers in the event of enquiries from relevant authorities.

Material, Labelling and Future PPWR Requirements

The PPWR is implemented through a phased approach, with additional packaging requirements becoming applicable progressively over the coming years. Not all PPWR requirements applied from 12 August 2026. Several future requirements are dependent on implementing or delegated acts that have not yet been published or entered into force, and their final application dates may therefore be subject to change. Canon continues to monitor these regulatory developments and prepare for subsequent requirements as they become applicable, including the following key milestones:

- Labelling, from 12 August 2028 or 24 months after the entry into force of the relevant implementing acts, whichever is later: harmonised packaging labelling requirements, including information on material composition, will begin to apply in accordance with the applicable PPWR provisions.

- From 2030: further requirements will become applicable, including requirements relating to packaging minimisation, recyclability, recycled content and reuse, where applicable. Specific application dates and conditions vary by requirement and may depend on supporting legislation.
- From 2035: further recyclability requirements and performance criteria will apply, in accordance with the relevant PPWR provisions and applicable implementation timelines.
- From 2038 onwards: additional requirements and targets will apply progressively, including further developments relating to recycled content and reuse, where applicable.

These future requirements may include information relating to:

- Material composition and identification
- Recyclability and recycling-related information
- Reusability, where applicable
- Recycled content, where applicable
- Packaging labelling and consumer information
